Questions put to M<sup>r</sup> Trevie Surveyor of the Uppingham Road  
relating to the North Road from Uppingham to Rockingham with  
his answers

Q 1<sup>st</sup> If the Road be carried from Uppingham Road thro' Liddington  
to Caldecot or otherwise by Stoke Park Wale to Caldecot, then, if  
both Roads were to be made good at the publick Expence, what  
will be the annual difference in keeping each Road in Repair?

Answer — It will cost at least 15 annuallly to go thro' Liddington to  
Caldecot and I should think I had a bad bargain at 20 a year  
to keep the Road thro' Liddington in repair preferalbe to other

Q 2<sup>d</sup> If you had the making the Road to Caldecot and was to do it at your  
own Expence which Road would you take, by Stoke Park Wale or by  
Liddington?

Answer — By Stoke Park Wale, as I apprehend the materials be best  
that way, and the materials upon examination on the low Road —  
appearing to me to be very shallow loamy — and bad for the purpose
