I know that the fiftenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and twenty Thomas allam gon Customary Tenant of the said Mannor did out of Court by the Rodd according to the Customs of the said Mannor surrender into the hands of the Lord of the said Mannor by the hands of Peter pretty one of the Jurors there all that messuages Cotage or Tenement and Homestead situate and being in Liddington aforesaid and now or late in the tenure or occupation of the said Thomas allam his assigns or assigns and also all those severall parcells of arable Land Ley and meadow ground containing by estimation or reputed to be two halfe yard Lands (be the same more or lesse) now or late also in the tenure or occupation of the said Thomas allam his assigns or assigns and lying and being dispersedly in the parish and parishes of Liddington aforesaid and also all that close of pasture or enclosed ground now or sometime called prosly Close now or late also in the tenure or occupation of the said Thomas allam his assigns or assigns and lying and being in the parish of Liddington aforesaid and also all other the Coppyside Lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever of him the said Thomas allam within the said Mannor together with all the appurtenances to the said surrendered or mentioned to be surrendered promises or any of them belonging to the use and behoofe of Dorothy now wife of the said Thomas allam for and during the naturall life of her the said Dorothy and from and after her decease then to the use and behoofe of the said Thomas allam for and during his naturall life and from and after the decease of the survivor of them the said Thomas allam and Dorothy his wife then to the use and behoofe of the heirs of the body of sure of them the said Thomas and Dorothy as shall of them first depart this life by the body of sure of them as shall be the survivor of them lawfully begotten or to be begotten and for want of sure issue then to and for the use and behoofe of the said Thomas allam his heirs and assigns forever according to the Customs of the said Mannor
