 & all those two pieces of pasture lying on the East part of the said lammy Close  
 Rent 3<sup>s</sup> - all those seven lands then which were purchased of William Glye one mortgaged  
 or half that piece of land then belonging to his own yard land call lying within  
 the hedge there at or near and for the said all those two acres of arable  
 land & grass ground lying disperse has followeth vizt one land at Long carman  
 each: And also one half acre layd at fields and in Blackwell north & three other  
 lands being one and lying in arable land called young reeds & land of William  
 King one & a half with all singular then & every their appurtenances in addition aforesaid  
 now in the hand & occupation of William Chapman to the use & behoof of Thomas  
 Wadd son of Thomas Wadd his son & Thomas Slater of Haringworth in the County of  
 Northampton gentleman & their heirs & assigns for ever according to the Custom of the

 of good & lawfull money of Great Brittain with lawfull interest for the said above  
 upon the six & twentieth day of October which shall be in the year of our lord  
 1724 at one whole & entire payment without fraud or any delay then this surrender  
 shall be void or else to remain in full force strength and virtue
