Judith his wife then to the use & behoof of the heirs of the s^r. Watson Dooken by him the s^r.

Watson Dooken on the body of the s^r. Judith his wife lawfully begotten or to be begotten &

& for want of such heirs then to the use & behoof of him the right heirs of him the s^r.

Watson Dooken for ever as the Will of the Lord according to the custom of the s^d. Mannor.
