one messuage ^{and one messuage of land here to lord his land} and one yardland of the
and every of his apurtenances in Siddington
aforesaid now or late in the occupation of
George Sewell & Efram Manton of the one part to the use and
 behoofe of ^{Jonathan} Hollis Doctor in
Divinitie and of his heirs and assigns
for ever according to the Custome of
the Mann'd aforesaid.

Upon this Surrender notwithstanding that if the above
named Richard Munn his heirs executors or assigns
or any of them shall well and lawfully pay or cause
to be ^{paid} and truly paid unto the above named
^{Jonathan} Hollis his contine Attorney executors
or administrators the full and just summe of three
hundred and eighteene & x pounds of good and
lawfull money of England all one entire payment
all in and upon the twentieth Day of January next
shall be in the year of our Lord God according to the
Computation of the Church of England one thousand
Six hundred Sixty and two all or in the new
Mansion house of the said ^{Jonathan} Hollis
situate in Nottingham in the County of Northtton
then the above written Surrender to be void or else
stand in full force and vertue.
