Will proved 1602

1 In the name of God Amen The last daie of June in the yeare  
2 of oure lorde god One thowsand sixe hundred I Anne Digbie of Stoke Dry in the County  
3 of Rutland widdowe of good and perfect memorie (god be thanked) doe ordeine and make  
4 this my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge Firste I comend my  
5 sowle into the hande of almightye god and my bodye to be buryed in the Chancell of the  
6 parrishe church of Stoke Drye aforesaid in the Tombe of my husband deceased  
7 Item I give to my Sonne Watson one of my Broode Mares *whiche* he will chuse Item  
8 I give to my Daughter Watson my guilt salte Item I give to their Children to be  
9 equally dyvyded amongst them Tenn poundes Item I give to my Daughter Anne  
10 Norwiche a guilt Bowle Item I give to my Sonne Dudley and to my Daughter Dudley  
11 and to their three children Tenn poundes to be equally dyvyded amonge them Item I  
12 give to my Sonne Maynwaringe Five poundes and to my Daugher Maynwaringe five  
13 poundes and to their Children to be equallye dyvyded amonge them Tenn poundes in all  
14 Twentie poundes *which* they have latelie borrowed receyved and had of me Item I give to  
15 Granndchilde Everarde Digbie one broude baye trottinge Fyllye *which* he latelie had from  
16 me and that other yearelinge Fillie *which* was of the same olde Mare of myne in the upper  
17 Halliocke Alsoe I give to him one Frame of Tymber ordeined for a Rooffe for the Corne  
18 Chamber Alsoe I doe forgive him that Sixescore poundes of Debte *which* were dewe unto  
19 me by my Sonne Everard Digbie deceased Soe that my said granndchilde Everarde  
20 Digbie doe permitte and suffer my Executor quicklie to have egresse and regresse to  
21 take and remove all suche goods as doe belonge unto me and are \to be/disposed by my last will  
22 and Testament and doe not challenge anie Recompence for default or Reparacions or by  
23 ympeachment of waste done by me or my assignes Item I give to the rest of my Sonne  
24 Everard Digbie his Children to eache of them Fourtie shillings Item I give more to  
25 his Daughter Marie Digbie Twentie shillings and one silver Cuppe with a Cover  
26 havinge these letters uppon it M.D. Item I give to my Sonne Sherrard my baulde  
27 Mare in the Ladie Acre Item I give to my Daughter Sherrard my baulde Mare  
28 in the woodfield Item I give to her my Coache with all the Furniture belonging Item  
29 I give to her the one half of my Lynnen and half of my Pewter and half of my Brasse  
30 Item I give to her Daughter Anne Sherrard virginalles Item I give to her twoe

31 sonnes William Sherrard and Kellam Sherrard one score of sheepe in the Woodfield  
32 Item I give to my granndchilde Symon Norwiche Twentie shillings Item I give to  
33 my Sonne James Digbie and to his twoe children to eache of them Twentie shillings  
34 Item I give to John Nicholls the elder my Man the white Mare *which* I boughte of him  
35 Item I give to him Fower poundes Item I give to him one Cowe Item I give James Cooke one  
36 Cowe Item I give to eache other of my howshold servantes one Sheepe Item to eache of  
37 them in monie Sixe shillings eighte pence beside their quarters wages Item I doe constitute  
38 appointe and make my Daughter Anne Watson of Rockingham and my Daughter Elizabeth  
39 Maynwaringe Executors of this my laste will and testament Item I doe give to my Sonne  
40 John Digbye of Sutton my silver Bason and Ewer Item I give to Kenelme Digbie his  
41 Sonne one silver Bowlle and cover to it parcel guilt Item I give to his Daughter  
42 Anne Digbie one Cowe Item to the Repaire of the parrishe church of Stoke I give  
43 Fourtie shillinge Item to Uppingham Church Twentie shillinge Item to Lyddington  
44 Church Twentye shillinge Item I give to my Maide Anne Tarrolde one Cowe Item  
45 I give tenn ponde more to be equallye dyvyded amonge my Daughter Watsons children  
46 Item I give to oulde John Nicholls the Furniture of his Chamber where he lyeth Alsoe  
47 one of the younge Mares in the Woodfield *which* were of my Carte Mares *which* he will choose  
48 Item I give to my Daughter Sherrards Daughters One score of my sheepe in the woodfield  
49 Item I give to my Mayden Emmy Haynes one Cowe And I give to my Daughter Sherrards  
50 Mayde Grace twoe sheepe Item I give to Anne Tarrolde one Fetherbedd *which* is in the  
51 Inner Chamber *within* my Lodginge chamber Item I give to my sonne John Digbie and my  
52 Daughter Sherrard all that is in the Clossett excepte the Bookes Item I give to John Stevyns  
53 one sheepe in the woodfielde And in witness that this is my last will and testament I have  
54 hereunto sett my hand and all these wittnesses whose names are underwritten Item I give  
55 more to John Nicholls the elder Fower sheepe Item I give to John Nicholls the younger one  
Cowe  
56 *which* he will chuse Anne Digbie John Digbie Bridgitt Sherrard Marie Digbie Ambrose  
57 Waide John Nicholls his marke
