1 In the Name of God Amen
2 I Clement Pretty of Liddington in the County of Rutland Tanner
3 being of a sound and perfect memory and remembrance blessed be
4 God To make this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme
5 following First I commit my Soul into the hands of Almighty God in
6 hopes of the alone merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour to receive full
7 pardon and forgiveness of all my Sins and as for my body to be buried
8 in Christian burial at the discretion of my Executor hereafter nominated
9 and \as/ for my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
10 withal I do dispose thereof as followeth Imprimis I give and bequeath
11 to Mary Pretty my now loving Wife half my Household goods Item I
12 give and bequeath to my Son Clement Pretty of Bullick in the County
13 of Northampton Tanner the Summe of Ten Pounds of lawfull money
14 of great Brittain upon this Condition that he shall not in any manner
15 molest or interrupt my Executor hereafter nominated in the Execution
16 of this my last Will and Testament in the disposing of my personal
17 Estate for the payment of the Legacyes in this my last Will and
18 Testament bequeathed And if my aforesaid Son Clement Pretty shall
19 give any disturbance or cause or procure any disturbance to be made
20 or done by any meanes or manner whatsoever then my Will is that
21 my said Son Clement shall not have the Ten pounds before bequeathed
22 but shall have the Summe of one Shilling and no more Item I give to my
23 Son John Pretty of Duddington in the County of Northampton Tanner
24 the Summe of one Shilling Item I give and devise to my Son Peter Pretty
25 of Liddington aforesaid Tanner and his Heires and Assignes for
26 ever All and every my Freehold Lands Tenements and Hereditaments
27 lyeing in Liddington aforesaid and Thorp by Water in the County of
28 Rutland my Freeholds in Liddington which is limited to Mary my
29 loving Wife for her life to take After her decease Item I give to my
30 Daughter Mary Hill the Wife of John Hill of Liddington aforesaid

31 Yeoman the summe of one Shilling Item all the rest and residue of my
32 goods and Chattells and personal estate whatsoever that is unbequeathed
33 after my debts paid and funeral expenses discharged I give and
34 bequeath to my Son Peter Pretty aforesaid and do make him Sole
35 Executor of this my last Will and Testament And I do hereby revoke
36 all other Wills by me at any time made heretofore In Witness
37 hereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Twenty Second
38 day of March Anno Domini 1714. Clement Pretty. Signed Sealed
39 and delivered in the presence of us and Signed by us in the presence
40 of the Testator. John Pretty. William Carter. John Townesend.

Summary of Latin Probate clause

Probate granted in London fourth of November Seventeen Twenty to Peter Pretty son of the deceased.
