Will proved 1637

TNA PROB 11/174

1 Anno Domini One thousand sixe hundred thirty sixe, the fourtenth of February
2 In the name of God Amen I Thomas Redshew the Elder of
3 Caldecutt in the county of Rutland Laborer being in *perfect* memory doth bequeath
4 my soule to God and my body to be buryed in the Churchyard of Caldecutt, Item I give
5 unto my wife Elizabeth Redshew and to my sonne Thomas Redshew all my money goods
6 Cattell moveable and imoveable whatsoever and make them both my full and sole executors
7 Item I give unto my brother Robert Redshew One suite of my best apparrell Item I give unto
8 Joane Dracutt halfe a quarter of Barley Item I give unto the poore one shilling Item I
9 give unto Mr Rudd to make a funerral sermon for me at my buriall three shillings foure
10 pence Thomas Redshew his marke. Walter Newbone.
