1 In the Name of God Amen
2 I Edmund Sismey of Liddington in the County of Rutland
3 Esquire being of sound and Disposing mind and memory
4 praised be to God for the same having revoked all former
5 Wills by me at any time heretofore made do make and
6 ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and
7 Form following (that is to say) I give and bequeath to
8 my Daughter Elizabeth Boon fifty pounds to be paid
9 within one year after my decease All the Rest and
10 Residue of my personal Estate of what nature and
11 Kind soever not herein before bequeathed I give and
12 bequeath the same unto my son Edmund Sismey and
13 hereby make and constitute my said Son Edmund Sismey
14 Sole Executor of this my Will In Witness whereof I have
15 hereunto set my hand and Seal this eighth day of May
16 in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred
17 and Forty Nine Edmon^d Sismey Signed sealed published
18 and declared by the above named Edmund Sismey the
19 Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the
20 Presence of us who at his Request and in his Presence
21 have subscribed our names as Witnesses hereunto
22 William Riddele Rob^t Ridlington
23 This Will was proved at London before the Right
24 Worshipfull John Bettesmoor the Doctor of Laws Master Keeper
25 or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully
26 constituted On the Twenty Sixth day of January in the Year
27 of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty Nine
28 by the Oath of Edmund Sismey the Son of the deceased and Sole
29 Executor named in the said Will To whom Administration was
30 granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of

31 The said deceased being first sworn duly to Administer.
