- 1 In the name of God Amen The foure
- 2 and twentieth day of June Anno Domini 1650 I Paule Sismey late of Thorpe in the
- 3 County of Roteland gentleman and now Lieutenant to Captaine White in Colonell Fleetwoodes
- 4 Regiment being of good and perfect memory (God bee praised) doe make and ordaine this
- 5 my last Will and Testament in manner and forme following, that is to say First I
- 6 commend my soule into the hands of God my maker hopeing assuredly through the
- only merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour to be made Partaker of life everlasting And
- 8 I commend my body to the earth whereof it is \now/ made nowe. Imprimis I give and
- 9 bequeath unto my brother Edmund Sismey of Liddington in the county aforesaid Yeoman
- the summe of one hundred poundes whereof hee hath alreadie in his hands forty five poundes and
- the other fifty five pounds to bee paid him out of my Arrears from the state of England when
- my Executor shall obtaine and get the same to be disposed of either to his son or otherwise
- according to his will Item I give and bequeath unto his daughter Katherine halfe the linnen in my chest
- 14 at Thorpe which was my mothers. Item I also give the other halfe of my linnen in the said chest with
- the bedding which was my mothers unto Frances Sismey daughter to my brother John Sismey Item
- also I further give and bequeath unto my uncle Mr Thomas Harriatt Merchant of London
- the summe of ten poundes to buy a mourning suite of apparell. Item I give and bequeath unto
- my brother Shaxton and my sister his wife with my cousens their children the sum of twenty
- pounds out of that money which he hath in his hands to buy them necessaries what they shall seem
- 20 best for mourning Item I also give and bequeath unto my cousen Thomas Harriatt the sonne of
- Paule Harriatt four pounds which he hath already in his hands and twenty shillings more I give
- 22 him to buy mourning. Item I also give and bequeath unto Richard Pakeman of Thorpe
- 23 aforesaid the sum of three pounds to bee disposed of for the use of his children. Item I also give

- 24 and bequeath to John Falkner of Thorpe aforesaid the sum of twenty shillings. Item I give & bequeath unto
- Joane Kinde of Gretton the sum of twenty shillings. All the rest of my goods and Chattels
- unbequeathed and my funerall charges paid I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother John
- 27 Sismey of Thorpe aforesaid gent whom I doe hereby make & ordaine him my sole Executor of
- this my last wil & Testament. And doe earnestly desire Stephen Captaine White and Lawrence Peach
- of Uppingham in the county of Rotel*and* Mercer supervisors of this my last will and Testament
  In
- 30 witnes whereof I the said Paule Sismey have hereunto set my hand and
- seale the day and yeere first above written Anno Domini One thousand six
- hundred and fifty Paule Sismey Sealed and delivered in the presence of
- 33 Richard Lowth John Massey
