1 In the Name of God Amen I Izabell Skelhorne of Caldecott
2 Widdow Doe make this my last will & testament as follow\eth/
3 First I Bequeath My So\u/le to Almighty God *which* Gave it me
4 and my body to be buried in the Churchyard of Caldecoate
5 and for my Goods & chatells I Bequeath in manner as
6 followeth; Imprimis I Give to Robert Skelhorne My yonger
7 Son one bed one Mattris one fether Pillow & a wooll bolster one
8 red Blankett one payr of hempen Sheets one Cubbord & one
9 joynt Stoole, Item I Give unto Elizabeth Skelhorne his
10 Daughter one pewter flagon the Lesser Bruing pan & the too
11 Least pans three tubs, Item I Give unto the abovesayd Robert
12 Skelhorne my Son all the boord that belongs to My house & one
13 hovell of Wood in the yard & one horse trough; Item I Give unto
14 Ann Nubon My Grandchild one bed one new Mattris one fether
15 bolster & two feather Pillows one new hilling one new blankett and
16 an over worn blankett three fine flaxen Sheets & one Course
17 flaxen, & two other hempen Sheets two holland Pillowbeers
18 & two flaxen Pillowbeers one boord Cloth all wide three new
19 flaxen napkins onmade & one old harden Napkin two chargers
20 & two lesser pewter Dishes & one Pewter Candlestick
21 one tin Drippingpan & one Dozen of new trenchers and one
22 table & a furm one trunck & a Chest & five pound of
23 Mony; All these are to be payd by My Executor unto the
24 above sayd Ann Nubon when She Shall Accomplish the age
25 of one & twenty years, Item I Give unto the Above Sayd Ann
26 My best woollen Suit one new [*word crossed out*] & a holland Apron
27 Item My Mind is if My Grandchild Ann Nubon dies before
28 She comes at Age that My Son Robert Skelhorne Should
29 have all the moveable Goods & that My Son Walter My
30 Executor Should have the five pound of mony, Item I give

31 unto Elizabeth Skelhorne the Daughter of Walter Skelhorne
32 one pewter Dish & a new flaxen Napkin & one warming pan
33 & the biggest Bruing pan, Item I Give unto Ann the Daughter
34 of Walter four pound of mony, Item I Give unto Sarah
35 the Daughter of Walter one pewter bason & one Napkin a flaxen one
36 & one porridge pott; Item I Give unto Robert Skelhorne
37 the Son of Walter Skelhorne twenty Shillings \&/ one Chest;
38 As for all the Goods unbequeathed I give unto My Son Walter
39 Skelhorne *which* I make my full & Sole executor
