Agred the 1<sup>st</sup> April 1728 w<sup>t</sup> John Larratt of Liddington Com<sup>y</sup>.  
 Robt Husbandman That he shall hold the Land in his tenur  
 mentioned late in the tenur of James Murdock for the Term of  
 three years from Lady Day last when he enters on the Takings  
 thereof w<sup>t</sup> w<sup>t</sup> goes throu<sup>th</sup>. And he is to pay the yearly rent of  
 Six pounds & ~~four~~<sup>four</sup> shillings by half yearly pay<sup>t</sup> the first  
 pay<sup>t</sup> whereof to be at Lady Day 1729 James Murdock being to  
 pay the rest for twelve next. He is to manure & order the said  
 Land insuffici<sup>t</sup> & husbandly manner so as to keep the same  
 in good heart & condition & not to cross crop plow or sow the  
 same out of season according to the usual course of the field at

Luddington aforesaid, & he is to have the same at the End of  
the Term in good Part & order - This Agmt. was made  
the 1<sup>st</sup> of April 1729 witness our hands /
