with Gyldecote ^{Baron of Bullogh} April in the yere of our Lord Christ according to the Anno Regni apud Anglandis 1552. By
the Esteward theris Jarroldes as followeth Ht this Court Edward Waterfoile hath surrendered into the handes of
the Lord by the handes of Jamys Monterone of the Servans of this Maner thre Cottages with Chapellories in
Liddington & other place of him the sayd Edward for durynge the durence of his naturall life clut after his
decease to the Rose & blythe of Edward Waterfoile his comeys Elizabeth his wife and to their heires and assyndes of
the said Edward Waterfoile the comys for ever to whom the Lord by hit Esteward hath þereof granted to be in
þe handes and to hould the same to the vses aforysaid all the will of the Lord according to the Customis of this Maner
þe holding therfore to the Lord yearly þy Rent & vies of Court & other þis or vies þerefor & due & aryst or mo
þy godes the Lord affynesse for þeire admittancie wh appardes in the Marquise haue made offaltes & ar declinited
ent.
