Winton the wife of Michael Wynth the wife of John Stratton the wife of James Stratton have granted wheat and good contrary to the order of
this Court And that Edmond Smyth James Winton Master Allen William Rubens gent William Winton Thomas Smyth James Hill
Thomas Boyden Robert Manton Robert Colvill John Walter Robert Carter and Thomas Winton have kept their sheeps in the waste field
and meadows after the tyme they ought to have been according to the order of this Court And that Thomas Boyden a widow do not
repaired these fences And that William Rubens Richard Stratton and William Downsend have trespassed in these sheeps upon the
wether pasture And that Edward Smyth hath entreated w^{ch} an had land in the wether pasture all a place called the longe lode And that Thomas
Boyden and William Winton have broken the ponde And that the said William Winton and Thomas Boyden have trespassed in keeping horses in one
field for w^{ch} they had no right of Comon And that William Downsend John Johnson Richard Ward Henry Dierke Robert Boyer Master Allen
John Smyth Thomas Wroon Peter Hatgott Robert Carter a kneeling right have in likewise trespassed w^{ch} horses And that William Winton
William Rubens gent a Stephen Manton have kept one cowe a year on the pasture longer then they had w^{ch} them for them And that William Winton
Boyden and John Doston have kept more sheeps then they had right of Comon for And that William Winton and Robert Carter have taken in sheeps
out them in their flock therefore they are amerced to the lord the soulders some of theye sold upon their heads

And at this court it was found by the homage that John Woodcock who held to him and his heirs by copy of Court rolls all the wille of the
lord according to the custom of this manor one yard land w^{ch} the apartment in Liddington afore said some tyme Hugh Wroon and one messuage in
Liddington afore said some tyme William Wroon and one other messuage and in half a yard land there into belonging w^{ch} the apartment in Liddington
afore said w^{ch} distended from Christopher Woodcock deceased onto the said John Woodcock and one other messuage or tenement a close of pasture there into
adjoining w^{ch} the apartment some tyme John Wroon and one close of pasture w^{ch} the apartment in Liddington some tyme Robert Carter And that John
Woodcock an infant (that is to say) of the age of fourteen years or thereabouts is some of the said John Woodcock deceased and heirs into the premises who being
present in person all this Court desired to be admitted tenant unto the said John Woodcock some of the said John Woodcock deceased and of his heirs
to hold the said premises w^{ch} there and duty of these apartments unto the said John Woodcock some of the said John Woodcock deceased and of his heirs

years (if shee shall see longer live) all the will of the lord according to the custom of this manor rendering to the lord yearly the Rents and
services there due or shee gave the lord a fine or is admitted tenant
