19 And Moses Allen upon his oath beinge sworn in open Court examined by the Jurors did testify & declare that there is certaine Coppin houte vizt was his fathers & lieth with in the hamlet of Mr William Fawcett that he knoweth how far it goeth — further saith that there is a Cottages lieth with in the said hamlet & knowne by the name of Barons Cottages vizt hath all his time bin accounted a Coppin houte Cottages — thus far hee
