 acceptance of Peter Petty a Customary Tenant of the manor aforesaid by the rod all
 that Cottage or Tenement in Redington aforesaid with the tenure of Edward Rowlat with the
 appurtenances within the manor aforesaid To the use behoof of Thomas Hurst of
 Stamford in County of Lincoln Esq of his heirs assigns forever according
 to the Custom of the manor aforesaid

Provided always upon this Condition notwithstanding That if the said Nicholas Jordan his
 heirs Executors or Assigns or any of them shall do well truly pay or cause to be paid
 unto the said Thomas Hurst his heirs Executors or Assigns a full just Sum of Nineteen
 pounds of good & lawful money of Great Britain with Lawful Interest for some
 without any Addition or Abatement at Year end upon the Eighteenth Day of April
 next ensuing the date of here then the said Land to Edward Rowlat to remain in

full force & virtue
