

The Manor of Siddington in Calderott in the County of Middlesex Memorandum that on the twenty second day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & thirty Lewis Woodrook a customary tenant of the Manor aforesaid in open Court did surrender into the hands of the Lord of the said Manor by the hands of John Blackwell Steward thereof by the rod All those severall parcels of arable land by & meadow ground hereinafter named that is to say One land at Banke the lands now a late of Robert Ward West one land at Broadhouse the lands now a late of Mr. Blackwell North one rood at White roads the lands now a late of Walter Freeman North one rood in usher white roads the lands now a late of Watson Bradshaw North one half acre & by ground at Robert John one land at four furlong the lands now a late of Thomas Cave West one rood more three the lands now a late of Watson Bradshaw West one rood of land over the way the lands now a late of Robert Ward East one land at Waterfalls the lands now a late of Walter Freeman North one land at Wark the lands now a late of Robert Smith East one land at Short furlong the lands now a late of the said Walter Freeman on the West one dole in the new meadow the lands now a late of William Hill on the South one dole in the old meadow the lands now a late of John Brown South with all & singular their appurtenances in Calderott aforesaid & late in the tenure or occupation of William Chapman do the use & behoof of John Chapman the younger of Siddington aforesaid Upon his heirs & assigns at the will of the Lord according to the custom of the said Manor
