

Clause of Watson Bradshaw's Will dat 19<sup>th</sup> April 1730: Item I give to my Nephew Watson  
 Dooker Clerk all that Copyhold house quartow land & appurtenances thereto belonging situate being &  
 lying in Caldrot in the County of Rutland now in the tenure of Edward Muggleton to him my said  
 Nephew & his heirs for ever Item I give to my said Nephew Watson Dooker all that Copyhold quartow  
land situats being & lying in Caldrot afores? which I bought of Thomas Case & is now in the tenure  
 of William Souler of Caldrot to him my said Nephew & his heirs for ever Item I give to my said  
 Nephew Watson Dooker all that Copyhold house & farm & appurtenances thereto belonging situate being &  
 lying in Caldrot afores? which is settled upon my wife for her life & is now in the tenure of William  
 Souler of Caldrot after the decease of my wife to him my said Nephew & his heirs for ever provided  
 always that to the s<sup>r</sup> Watson Dooker or his heirs shall pay or cause to be paid upon demand to the  
 same fifth pounds a piece to my Nephews Nathaniel Dooker John Dooker Samuel Dooker & William Dooker  
 and fifth pounds to my Nephew's Cousin or their heirs & fifth pounds to her the daughter of my said Nephew  
 Cousin or in case she the said Anne Cousin junior be then dead to her surviving brothers & sisters -  
 by her father William Cousin deceased & also fifth pounds to my sister Abnera Dooker if she be then alive
