according to the custom of the said Mannor conditioned for the payment of one hundred
pounds with legal interest for the same of lawfull money of Great Britain before
or upon the sixteenth day of April which should then be in the Year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred & eight teen as by the s^d Surrender appeared And whereas
the s^d Sum of one hundred pounds with all interest for the same hath been paid unto me
the s^d Robert Smith in full discharge of the said Surrender

This is therefore authorize & empower You the s^d John Blackwell to deliver
up the s^d written Surrender unto the s^d Moses Allen to be cancelled & made
void & for You so doing this shall be Your sufficient warrant Witness
my hand this tenth day of April Anno Domini 1732.
