 Calvert in the County of Rutland — our Lord one thousand seven hundred & thirty two John Townsend
 (by virtue of a certain letter of Attorney granted to him by William Richards ambaſſador
 to the Manor aforesaid for that purpose bearing date the fourth day of April last
 past) out of Court did surrender ^{in base} into the hands of the Lord of the said Manor by the hands
 of John Blackwell Gent Steward there by the King All the Estates right title interest use
 possession property claim & demand whatsoever of him the said William Richards & in
 to one Messrs attorneys formerly in town of John Craden son. & was in house of
 John Forepole situated in Eddington aforesaid within the Manor aforesaid. So the use &
 school of William Ematt of Eddington aforesaid house & his heirs & assigns for ever
 according to the custom of the said Manor.
