**Francis JARMAN, yeoman of Caldecott**

**Will proved 1658**

**TNA PROB 11/283**

1 In the name of God Amen  
2 I Francis Jarman of Caldecott in the County of Rutland yeoman being in perfect  
3 health and remembrance doe make this my last will and testament trusting in the mercies  
4 of Christ Jesus and through his death and passion to bee saved and my body to bee buried  
5 in the Churchyard of Caldecott Item I give unto my Sonne Francis Jarman one Silver Cupp  
6 one presse in the upper parlour to bee as a standard to the house and one chest in the neither  
7 parlour and one bedstead and all the cloathes that belonge unto the bedstead and one Chaire  
8 and two pewter dishes and one board Cloats, and halfe a dozen of napkins Item I give unto  
9 my Sonne Francis Jarman halfe my lease of demesne after the terme of tenne years and  
10 six strike of Barley and six strike of pease towards the soweing of his land when hee shall come  
11 to age Item I give unto my eldest daughter Jane Jarman two silver spoones one bedstead with  
12 all such furniture as belonges unto a bedstead and five paires of sheetes and one halfe dozen of  
13 napkins and two board Cloathes and five dishes of pewter and one Candlesticke and one salt  
seller  
14 and one brasse pott and one brasse panne and one Coffe and one box and one Chaire and one  
15 frame stoole Item I give unto my eldest daughter Jane Jarman the summe of thirty pounds to  
bee  
16 paid her at the age of one and twenty years by my executor Item I give unto my youngest  
17 daughter [?Fe...] Jarman the summe of thirty pounds to bee paid to her at the age of one and  
18 twenty years by my executor Item I give unto my youngest daughter [?Fe...] Jarman two  
19 silver spoones and one bedstead with all such furniture as belonges to a bedstead and five paire  
of  
20 sheetes and one halfe dozen of napkins and two board Cloathes and five dishes of pewter and  
one  
21 Candlesticke and one salt seller and one brasse pott and one brasse panne and one Coffe and  
one  
22 box and one chaire and one frame stoole Item if any of my two daughters shall dye before they  
come  
23 to the age of one and twenty years then shée that shall bee then alive shall have halfe her sisters

24 portion and the other halfe to my wife and my sonne Francis Jarman Item I give unto Jane  
Jarman  
25 my wife halfe my lease of Demesne and all there is of my goodes unbestowed and make her full  
26 and sole executrix of this my last will and testament Francis Jarman his marke Wittnesses  
27 Walter Newbone George Seareman
