1 In the name of God Amen
2 The ninth daie of June In the yere of our Lord Christ One
3 Thousand Six Hundred Fiftie and Five I Anthonie
4 Winter of Liddington in the Countie of Rutland, yeoman
5 being sick in bodie but of good and perfect memorie thanks bee
6 rendered to the Lord doe make and declare this my last will &
7 Testament in manner & forme following First of all I commit my
8 soule unto Allmightie God and my bodie to be buried in such place
9 where it shall please my Executors to appoint And now for the setting of
10 my Temperall estate and such goods & chattles as it hath pleased God to
11 conferr upon me I give and dispose the same in manner & forme following
12 First of all I give unto my sonne James Winter Five shillings Also I give to
13 my daughter Elizabeth Seaton Five shillings Also I give unto my daughter
14 Jane Peart Five shillings Also I give and bequeath to all my Grandchildren
15 that are now Living two shillings Six pence to each child of my said children
16 above mentioned Also I give and bequeath to my Loving sonne Anthonie
17 Winter my bed in the Parlor which I usuallie lye in with all the fur-
18 -niture thereunto belonging One brasse pott two brasse panes Six Pewter
19 dishes, Two Candlesticks two barrels one table cloth Six Napkins
20 half a dozen of Spooones, Two Kinnells, One rack of iron & Hooks in the
21 Hall, One Coffe one Chayre in the Chimney, One Spitt & Cobirons
22 one dripping-pan, my presse in the Parlor, One Chaire in the Hall
23 Also I give and bequeath to my Loving sonne John Winter the bed in the
24 Hall chamber with the beds head towards the street with all the furniture
25 thereunto belonging The ark in the kitchin, one kinnell the Copper &
26 Mash fatt, one Fat in the Buttery, Two barrels two pewter Platters
27 half a dozen of Spooones The table and frames & formes in the Hall
28 & all my Horseracks and Mangers Cow Cribbs & Hovells in the Fouleyard
29 & my Hovell in the Closse or Croft my Rack of iron in the kitchen and
30 Hookes used therewith, One table Cloth half a dozen of Napkins &

31 a Coffe Also I give to my Loving daughter Anna Winter my bedsted
32 in the Hall Chamber standing with the Head thereof towards the Chamber
33 over the Parlor with the Feather bed and furniture thereunto belonging.
34 The Presse in the Chamber And all the rest of my brasse Pewter
35 Linnen and Household goods undisposed of whatsoever Also I give
36 unto my said Loving daughter Anna Winter Thirtie pounds of good
37 & lawfull money of England **Also** I give and bequeath to my
38 said Loving sonne Anthonie Winter all the rest of my goods, bonds
39 Billes Cattell & Chattels whatsoever and all the money that is
40 owing to me by or from anie person or persons whatsoever. My Legacies
41 & funerall expenses being discharged & paid Also I doe make & constitute
42 my said Loving sonne Anthonie Winter sole Executor of this my last will
43 and Testament. Lastlie I doe hereby nominate my Loving friends William
44 Newbone gent and John Ward Clerk Supervisors of this my Will
45 **In Witness** whereof I have hereunto putt my hand & seale
46 the daie and yere first above written. Anthonie Winter his marke
47 Signed sealed & published in the presence of us John Ward Clerk
48 William Newbon James Winter

Summary of Latin Probate clause

Proved at London 4th December 1655 by Anthonie Winter the son of the deceased
