Lewis WOODCOCK the Elder, of Caldecott

Will proved 1829

1 I LEWIS WOODCOCK the Elder of Caldecott in  
2 the County of Rutland Gentleman do hereby revoke all Wills Codicils and other  
3 testamentary dispositions by me at any time heretofore made and do publish  
4 and declare this to be my last Will and testament First I give and bequeath to  
5 the several persons hereinafter named the several Legacies or sums of Money  
6 following (that is to say) To my Son Thomas Woodcock of Leicester the sum  
7 of Ten pounds to my Daughter Catherine Tilley the wife of William Tilley of  
8 Cottingham in the County of Northampton the sum of Ten pounds to my Son  
9 John Woodcock of Middleton in the said County of Northampton Yeoman the  
10 sum of Ten pounds To my son Lewis Woodcock of Caldecott aforesaid Yeoman  
11 the sum of Ten pounds To my Daughter Maria Sculthorpe Wife of Joseph  
12 Sculthorpe of Great Easton in the County of Leicester Yeoman the sum of Ten  
13 pounds to my Son Simons Woodcock of Caldecott aforesaid Yeoman the sum of  
14 ten pounds to my Son Robert Woodcock of Great Easton aforesaid Miller the  
15 sum of Ten pounds To my daughter Rhoba the wife of John Ashby of Rothwell  
16 otherwise Rowell in the said County of Northampton Blacksmith the sum of  
17 Ten ponds and to my Daughter Sarah Woodcock of Caldecott aforesaid Spinster  
18 the sum of Ten Pounds All which said several legacies I direct shall be paid to  
19 the several Legatees respectively within Twelve Calendar months next after my  
20 decease All that my Copyhold Messuage or Tenement with the Yard Garden and  
21 homestead outbuildings and Appurtenances thereto adjoining and belonging  
22 situate and being in Cottingham aforesaid now in the Occupation of  
23 Thomas Hindley and all other my hereditaments and real Estate whatsoever and  
24 wheresoever And also my household goods plate linen china and household  
25 furniture ready money securities for money debts owing to me and all the rest  
26 residue and remainder of my Personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever and of  
27 what nature and kind soever (subject nevertheless to the payment of my just debts  
28 funeral and testamentary expenses and the charges of proving this my will and to  
29 the payment of the several Legacies hereby given) I give devise and bequeath unto  
30 and to the use of my youngest Son William Woodcock of Caldecott aforesaid Baker

31 his heirs executors and administrators and assigns for ever according to the nature and  
32 quality of such real and personal Estates respectively I give devise and bequeath  
33 to my said Son William Woodcock his heirs executors administrators and assigns  
34 All the estates vested in me or any Trusts or by way of Mortgage and which I have  
35 power to dispose of by this my Will with the appurtenances attending to the nature  
36 and quality of respectively Upon the several Trusts and subject to the equity of  
37 redemption which at the time of my decease shall be subsisting or capable of  
38 taking effect But the money secured to me by or upon any such Mortgages shall be  
39 considered and taken as part of my Personal Estate and I appoint my said Son William  
40 Woodcock sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof  
41 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirty first day of July in the year of  
42 Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight S Woodcock *senior* signed sealed  
published les[?see]  
43 and declared by the above named Lewis Woodcock the Testator as and for his  
44 last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence at his request  
45 and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as Witnesses thereto  
46 (videlicet) Henry Shuttleworth Tho[ma]s. Ingram H. Wartnaby *Junior*  
47 Attorneys M Harbrough  
48 PROVED at London 27th June 1829 before the judge by the Oath of  
49 William Woodcock the Son and Sole Executor to whom Administration was granted  
50 having been first sworn by Commission duly to Administer
